 A minimum average of 65% (2.5 on a 4 point scale) is required to be eligible for admission consideration.

- The course requirements above are for teaching French language and literature as a subject. This can be at the Core French or French Immersion language level.
 - All applicants to the French options (either Core French or French Immersion) must complete an acceptable French proficiency assessment** before their admission to the program is confirmed.  - French **Immersion** options are also available for applicants who wish to teach biology, chemistry, earth science, physics, history, geography, social science, mathematics in the French language. In addition to meeting the **language proficiency requirement** (French Immersion level) and **specific course requirements** and for the teachable subject (see applicable worksheets), applicants will need to have completed 9 credits of French coursework at the 200 - 400 level: French composition (3 credits), French grammar (3 credits), and French literature (3 credits)
 - A degree in translation does not satisfy the admission requirements unless the content of the degree contains courses in French grammar, French composition and French literature at the third or fourth year level. Students may need to take additional courses in the areas specified above before applying.
 - Applicants whose first language is French and who completed a degree in a French-language university in a country or a province where French is the principal language should consult the Teacher Education Office about their French course requirements.
