Breadth of coverage required for History Education

Coursework must include at least one history course in all of the following areas: (courses at any level acceptable)

- a. Canadian history - (ie: HIST 235, 305, 324, 326, 329, etc.)
b. European history - (ie: HIST 317, 319, 365, 366, etc.)
c. History of any region other than Canada or Europe - (ie: HIST 250, 349, 380, etc.)

Canadian Content

Coursework must include a minimum of 6 credits of Canadian content. ie: HIST 235, POL 101, GEOG 327 etc. These 6 credits are not in addition to the coursework required above, but can be part of the courses used to meet the academic requirements as outlined above.

Admission Average Calculation

A minimum average of 65% (2.5 on a 4 point scale) is required to be eligible for admission consideration.

Calculated on 18 senior level credits of history coursework in section 3) above.

Notes:

- 1. Social Science: course work taken in anthropology, economics, political science, Canadian studies, regional studies, criminology, gender studies, Aboriginal studies, religious studies of a non-doctrinal nature, classical studies, urban studies, and environmental studies may be included. Courses in philosophy and psychology can not be used towards the social science teachable.
2. Up to 6 credits of art history courses and/or classical studies courses from CLST 311, 312, 331,252, 256 may be accepted. The Faculty determines the acceptability of the courses.
3. A French Immersion option for teaching history in the French language is available. In addition to meeting the history course requirements above, applicants need to meet the language proficiency requirement (DELFI or DALF http://lled.educ.ubc.ca/programs/frappraisal/ and have to complete 9 credits of French coursework at the 200 - 400 level: French composition (3 credits) and French literature (3 credits)
