2) 30 credits of visual art coursework (including art history) in at least three areas. a. 18 credits of the total 30 credits must be senior level coursework (3xx – 6xx). b. The majority of coursework should cover at least three areas of traditional studio art such as drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, graphic/communication, design, ceramics and textiles. c. You may include 6 credits from digital arts, photography, animation, film/video/TV production, performance and socially engaged art. d. At least 6 credits in art history is required (non-studio coursework). A maximum of 6 credits of art history coursework can be used towards the total 30 credits of visual art coursework required.
