

(Note: French Immersion teachers may also teach core French). In addition to meeting the French Immersion Language Proficiency Requirement (see: http://teach.educ.ubc.ca/delf-dalf), applicants must also meet the specific course requirements for their chosen teachable subject/s (see applicable secondary worksheets).
- 5. A degree in translation does not normally satisfy the admission requirements unless the above requirements are met.
- 6. Applicants whose first language is French and who completed a degree in a French-language university in a country or a province where French is the principal language should consult the Teacher Education Office about their French course requirements.
