#### Breadth of coverage required for Geography Education

Coursework must include a minimum of **6 credits of Canadian content**. E.g.: HIST 235, POL 101, GEOG 327 etc. These 6 credits are not in addition to the coursework required above, but can be part of the courses used to meet the academic requirements as outlined above. The Teacher Regulation Branch defines its Canadian content requirement as "The focus of a Canadian studies course must be on understanding the Canadian experience. The Canadian content must be central to the conceptual thesis of the course rather than existing only as an example to support concepts of another discipline".

At least **two courses at any level required in each of a) physical geography** (e.g., GIS, environmental studies, etc.); **b) human geography** (e.g., cultural, historical, etc.).

#### Admission Average Calculation

A minimum average of 65% (2.5 on a 4 point scale) is required to be eligible for admission consideration.

Calculated on 18 senior level credits of geography coursework in section 3) above.

#### Notes:

- Social Sciences: course work related to history, geography and social science taken in anthropology, economics, political science, Canadian studies, regional Studies, criminology, gender studies, Aboriginal studies, religious studies of a non-doctrinal nature, classical studies, urban studies, and environmental studies may be included.
- Up to 12 credits of GEOS course work may be used towards fulfilling the requirements.
- An applicant presenting any two of UBC GEOS 327, 328 and 426 to fulfill the 6 credits of history requirement may not apply the same courses towards the geography requirements.
- The Faculty encourages applicants to take courses in Aboriginal studies (such as history, culture, geography, etc.).
- A **French Immersion** option for teaching geography in the French language is available. In addition to meeting the geography course requirements above, applicants need to meet the language proficiency requirement (DELF or DALF <http://teach.educ.ubc.ca/admissions/apply/language-proficiency-assessments/delf-dalf/>) and complete 6 credits (total) of French coursework at the 200 – 400 level comprised of 3 credits French composition and 3 credits French literature
