**Notes:**

1. **EDCP 312A Instrumental Pedagogy: Secondary** and **EDCP 313A Choral Pedagogy: Secondary** are pre-requisite courses for the B.Ed. program. Applicants who have completed similar courses at another university may be admitted to the B.Ed. program without having completed these courses at UBC, but they must register for EDCP 312A and EDCP 313A during the first term; they may be waived from taking one or both courses during the first week of the term by passing a pre-test demonstrating that they have the required skills and knowledge. Those who do not pass the pre-test at that time must complete EDCP 312A and/or EDCP 313A during the first term of the program, earning a minimum grade of **76%** in order to proceed to practicum.
2. Students completing a BA with a major in Music are not normally qualified for admission to the secondary option - Music. They would need to complete the same or similar courses in music that are required for completion of the B.Mus. with a major in General Studies (Secondary Education Stream) program. In other words, an applicant must have completed the specified areas outlined above as well as a breadth of coursework in Music.
3. Students are advised to complete the 4 credits of classroom instrumental techniques requirement during their B.Mus. degree program because courses to fulfill this requirement are not necessarily offered every year. Normally, it is not possible to take such courses during summer session, nor can they be taken concurrently with the BEd program.
4. The French immersion option is not available for Music.
