- Elementary: Kindergarten to Grade 7
- Middle Years: Grades 6 to 8 (ages 11 to 14 years)

SECONDARY (UBC VANCOUVER)

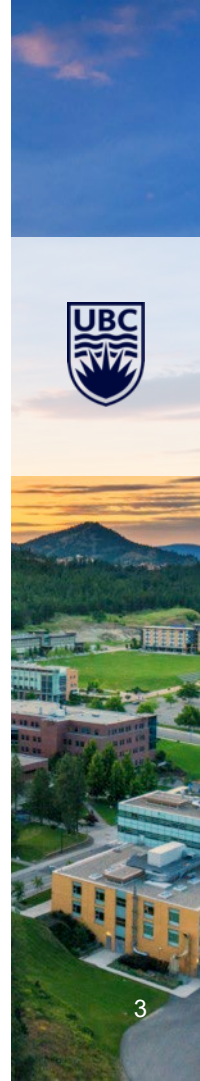
- Grades 9 to 12

- Elementary or Secondary

RURAL AND REMOTE PROGRAM (no intake scheduled for 2025/26)

- Elementary/Middle Years
- 24 month program in rural/remote locations in BC, with in-person summers

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

BACHELOR DEGREE



- **Equivalent to a 4-year 120 credit UBC degree**
(1,560 hours in-class coursework)
- **Can be from any accredited university or college**
(domestic and international)
- **Can be in any discipline**

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Elementary & Middle Years

You must present courses in the areas below:

Canadian Studies	3 credits
Canadian History/Geography	3 credits
English/French literature and composition	6 credits
Lab Science	3 credits
Mathematics	3 credits

Admission Average:

Calculated on most recent 60 credits. 65% minimum required for consideration.



ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Secondary



You must present minimum 30 credits of coursework focused in one teachable subject.

Teachable Area	Minimum 30 credits
English/French Comp & Lit	6 credits

Admission Average:

Calculated on 18-24 credits of upper-level coursework in teachable area. 65% minimum required for consideration.

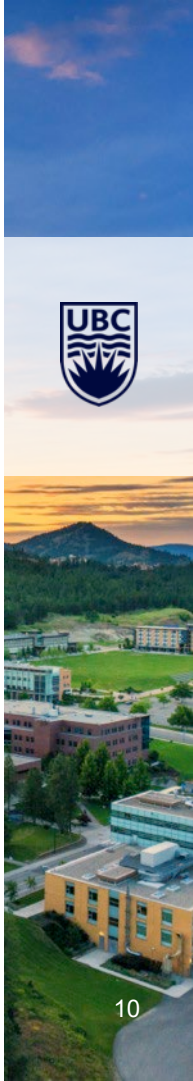

COMPLETING PREREQUISITES

- Applicants with courses in progress may still apply.
- Applications with degree and pre-requisite courses completed by January 31, 2025 are preferred for admission.

Final deadline for course completion: JUNE 30, 2025

EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

Why is experience evaluated?



What kinds of experience are relevant?

- Up to five education-related experiences
- Within five years (preferably within two years)

What are the minimum requirements?

- Minimum isn't necessarily competitive!
- 50 hours should be from a single, continuous experience

Creating opportunities

- Finding experience, and making it count

MINIMUM EXPERIENCE REQUIRED

Applicants should have 100 hours of relevant education-related experience with youth.



AGE GROUP	BEd PROGRAM OPTION
5 to 12 years old	Elementary
11 to 14 years old	Middle Years
13 to 17 years	Secondary

- Classroom-based experience preferred
- Coaching, group tutoring, summer camps, youth groups, faith groups also acceptable
- Experience can be in Canada or international (some Canadian experience recommended)
- 1-on-1 experience is considered on a case-by-case basis

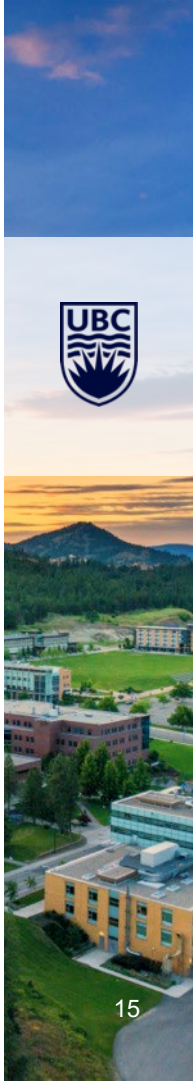
BEYOND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Go well above **100 hours!**
- Work with a variety of groups - cultural diversity, different learning needs, various educational contexts, socioeconomic diversity, 2SLGBTQ+, etc.
- Take an opportunity to be a **leader**, rather than only providing support.
- Teach your subject area.



PERSONAL PROFILE QUESTIONS

- 1. Why do you want to be a teacher?** Maximum 1,500 characters
- 2. Describe the kind of teacher you want to be.** Give examples.
Maximum 1,500 characters
- 3. Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Decolonization are integral to the teaching profession. Give one or more examples from your experience with youth that demonstrates work with individuals from varied backgrounds, perspectives, identities, and needs. Explain what you learned from the experience(s), and how this will prepare you to be an equitable educator.**
Do not repeat information already stated.
Maximum 1,500 characters

REFERENCES

TWO (2) professional references from appropriate individuals:

1. Must have experience working with youth or children.
2. Must have observed you working in group settings with age-appropriate students or youth.
3. Must be credible authorities who can speak competently about your experiences, interests, and abilities relevant to the teaching profession.



REFERENCES

Appropriate references:

- School administrator (e.g., principal, vice-principal) who has observed you around age-appropriate groups of youth
- Teacher at an elementary or secondary school
- Camp director
- Daycare program coordinator

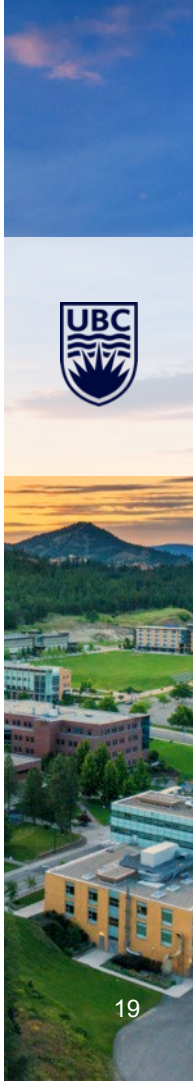
Inappropriate references:

- Family members
- Personal friends
- Non-education related employers
- Parent of a child whom applicant tutored privately
- University professor (who supervised TA work or did not observe around youth)
- Classroom teacher whose only relationship to you is as their student



REFERENCES

- Referees must not, at any point, disclose any parts of the reference report to the applicant.
- Applicants receive instructions in their application acknowledgement email.
- Applicants must input their referees' contact information into a separate portal at the time of application.
- It is the applicant's responsibility to follow up with their referees to ensure they have submitted their reports.

HOW DO I APPLY?

The UBC BEd application is online at apply.educationplannerbc.ca in **October 2024**.

Application and documentation deadline is January 31, 2025



NOTE: Applicants who have previously taken credits or who have completed or are currently completing their degree at UBC (or previously applied to UBC but did not attend) should provide their **legal name, date of birth, email address, and UBC student number** as they appear in their UBC student account. This will help to prevent any potential delays in processing and evaluation.

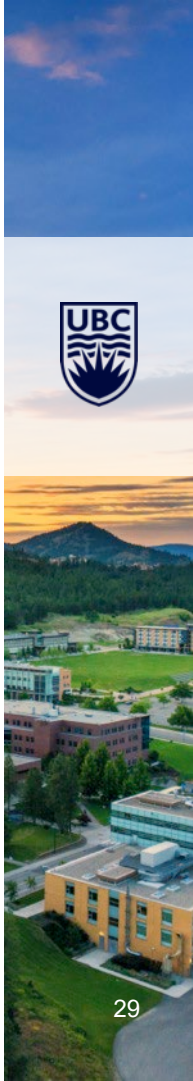
